Passport application form australia post

A Canadian passport is internationally accepted proof of your Canadian citizenship, as well as providing the best possible photo ID. If you are traveling outside of Canada, the Canadian Federal Government Department of Foreign Affairs advises you to bring a passport valid for at least six months beyond the scheduled return date. Children, including infants, cannot be listed on a parent's passport and must have their Own Canadian passport. A separate passport application must be submitted for each child. A standard adult passport is valid for 5 years, as well as passports for children from 3 to 15 years old. For children under 3 years, the maximum validity of the passport is 3 years. Because passport applications take longer to apply during peak hours, Passport Canada suggests trying to apply for a passport during the off-season between June and November. There are several versions of the Canadian passport application form depending on the age and place where you apply, so be sure to use the correct application form. Passport requirements can change, so take a new application form when you apply. You can pick up a Canadian passport application form: at a participating Canadian post office or service canada centre a Canadian passport office Online forms are in PDF. They can be interactively completed online, then printed, signed, and dated, and then sent in person or by mail with accompanying documents, or they can be printed and completed offline, then sent. When using online forms, be sure to select the correct form and carefully follow the instructions for printing and filling out the form. Outside Canada, in a Canadian consular office. You must send at least one document to support your identity and name to display in your Canadian passport. This document must be issued by a federal, provincial or municipal government. It must be valid and must include both your name and signature. A provincial driver's license is a good example. The original documents will be returned to you. If you send photocopies, send copies of both sides of the document. Your guarantor must sign and date all copies. A previous Canadian passport (not a photocopy) can be used as proof of identification if it is still valid or submitted within one year of expiration and the name is the same as that used on the current passport application. Additional documentation may be required. You must present the original proof of Canadian citizenship: if born within Canada - a birth certificate or a certificate of Canadian citizenship. (See changes to birth certificate requirements as of February 01, 2011.) born outside of Canada - a certificate of Canadian citizenship, a certificate of naturalization, a certificate of preservation of Canadian citizenship or a certificate of registration of birth abroad. Enclose any valid Canadian passport. There is no need to present expired passports. If you have a current passport that more than 12 months after the date of application, include a written explanation of why you are applying in advance. You must also submit any other travel document issued in the last five years. Have your passport taken and get two identical copies. Many photo processing shops and most photographers will take passport photos instantly and cheaply. Passport photos must be taken within 12 months of application; within a month if the application is for a child. Be sure to follow the specific standards set by the Passport Office for acceptable photos. Passport Canada provides a handy checklist (in PDF) that you can print and take with you when you go to the photographer. The name and address of the photographer and the date on which the photograph was taken must appear on the back of the passport photographs. Your guarantor must write a Certifico statement that this is a true similarity of (name) and sign the back of one of the passport photos, and sign and date any photocopies of the supporting documents. Your Canadian passport guarantor must be someone who has known you personally for at least two years and can verify your identity and that your statements are accurate. Your guarantor must be a Canadian citizen under the age of 18 and must be in possession of a valid Five-Year Canadian passport or a Canadian passport that has expired less than a year at the time of applying for a passport. The guarantor can be a member of your family. The guarantor must be accessible to Passport Canada for verification purposes and Passport Canada reserves the right to request a different guarantor. Your Canadian passport guarantor must be someone who has known you personally for at least two years and can verify your identity and that your statements are accurate. Your guarantor must live in the jurisdiction of the passport office and must be accessible to the contact of the passport office. Your guarantor must also be a member of one of the professions listed in the passport application form for Canadians living abroad (e.g. a doctor or practicing lawyer). You must also provide the names, addresses and phone numbers of two references that are neither your guarantor nor a relative. References must be people who have known you for at least two years. Your references may be contacted by Passport Canada to confirm your identity. Application rates for a Canadian passport vary depending on the type of passport and where you do it The passport application form will specify the processing fee. How processing fees are paid also varies depending on whether you apply in Canada, the United States, or outside of Canada and the United States. There are several ways to pay the Canadian passport application fee in Canada: in or debit card if you submit the application form in person; by certified check or money, payable to the General Recipient for Canada; or by credit card. Canadian passport application fees for Canadians living in the United States must be made in Canadian dollars. Rates can be paid by certified check, traveler's check, or international money order or bank money order payable to the General Recipient for Canada, or by credit card. Canadian passport application fees for Canadians living abroad must be paid in local currency. Consult your local passport issuance office for your current exchange rate. Payments can be made in cash, by certified check, traveler's check or international money order made for a fee at the Canadian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate, at random. Make sure you have the right passport application form. Read the general information and instructions on the application form carefully. Complete all required sections of the passport application form, otherwise your application will be declined. Signature inside the white box in section 1 of the passport application form. Make sure the signature doesn't touch the edge of the box. This signature will be used in your passport. Have your guarantor sign section 2 of the passport application form, sign the back of a photograph, and sign any photocopies (both sides) of the documents. Be sure to sign and date all three pages of the passport application form. The application form must be dated in the last 12 months. Attach all required documents and photos. Also, include your valid passport and any travel document issued in the last five years. Include the appropriate passport application fee. Double-check the question before sending it. Use the passport checklist to make sure the application is complete. If you send your application in person, you must also withdraw it in person. If possible, hand over your Canadian passport application in person. Canadian passport applications can be filed in person at a Passport Canada office participating in canada's post office (an additional fee will be charged) a Canada Participating Canada Post Office service center and Canada service centers handle only standard passport applications. Canadian government offices in the United States and Bermuda do not provide regular passport services. Passport applications must be sent by post or courier to Canada. If you are outside of Canada, the United States and Bermuda, your application must be filed in person at the office where you withdrew your passport application form or passport office. of the nearest passport in the country where you are visiting. Passports are returned by night courier. For courier a Passport Canada 22 de Varennes Building 22 de Varennes Street Gatineau, QC Canada J8T 8R1 Passport applications are only accepted by courier from Canada, the United States, Bermuda and Saint-Pierre et Miquelon. The standard times for processing passport applications vary depending on where you apply, the time of year, and the volume of applications. Passport Canada maintains a regular update on processing times (use the drop-down box at the top of the page to select your location) with the latest estimates. These estimates do not include delivery times. Passport applications may take longer to process during peak hours or in case of problems with the application. The non-peak time for passport applications in Canada is between June and November. If your passport application took longer than normal processing time, use the Online Passport Canada form to check the status of your Canadian passport application. Application.
